#### GOOD MORNING.....



#### **Research and Extension Activities**

The academic year 2017-18 also was very productive in terms of the extramural research undertaken by our research scholars and faculty members. Increased number of research publications indicates the growth and momentum of research activities in the campus. 51 research articles could be published in reputed peer reviewed journals based on the research work carried out in our campus. It is a matter of immense joy and pride that some of the publications are in highly reputed journals in the corresponding areas showcasing the top quality of work we are involved in. Though our college is an arts and science college, primarily focusing on teaching-learning activities of UG and PG programmes, we also give due importance to research as far as possible. Our research committee has been actively functioning in guiding and mobilizing the research activities undertaken by various departments. In the year 2017-18, several research projects/grants such as KSCSTE - Back to Lab Postdoctoral Research and student projects (three numbers) have been awarded. An add on course in Entrepreneurship Development of six months duration, Sponsored by KSHEC, with the enrolment of 34 students, has been offered in 2017-18. A MoU with ASAP Kerala also has been signed in the year, though which several test items have been constructed and initial test out of various subcomponents were carried out.

#### Quality Ensuring Bodies in our College

In order to ensure quality in teaching learning process and equipping the next generation with updated knowledge, quality ensuring bodies are working in our college. This include IQAC, CDC, and PTA

### Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of our college initiated a number of programmes in the current academic year and I congratulate the committee members and coordinator with a great applause. They empowered the other committees and faculties by providing directions/suggestions with regard to teaching-learning process in the institution. We have a planning committee under the coordination of Dr Dinesh Babu K V to prepare academic calendar of our college in tune with University calendar, and plan other academic activities. The college planning committee and purchase committee and IQAC work in coordination to ensure the overall institution's goals. The master plan of the college was prepared from the internal discussions and studies of IQAC. The IQAC makes necessary arrangement for obtaining feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholders which have been evaluated for quality improvement. The IQAC takes lead role in organization of inter and intra institutional workshops, seminars on quality related themes and advise faculty members to submit projects and get funds from various agencies. IQAC also has taken due responsibility in maintaining documents of various programmes and activities of the institution. Data available are further analysed to highlight areas requiring further follow up. During the year 2017-18, IQAC conducted many seminars for the enhancement of quality of the college. Talks on "GST", "Quality manangement", "Mahabharathavum randamoozhavum-'original' chinthakal", "Sthalanamankalum samasyakalum", "Some eat to live, others live to eat", "Malayala cinema ganankal - charithravazhikalilude", "The musical journey of Kishore kumar", Training for laboratory staff on lab safety, Musical presentation on the tiltle 'Soulful Mukesh', Seminar on 'NAAC-IQAC guidelines' were some of the programmes arranged by IQAC in the academic year 2017-18. Most importantly, feedbacks were taken from students and parents, analyse the same and took corrective measures for the improvement of teaching-learning process.

#### College Development Council (CDC)

To plan and execute the integrated development activities of our college, we have a College Development Council (CDC) under the chairmanship of our District Collector. It is an apex body of the college to ensure the development activities as per our master plan. The CDC meet periodically to ensure that the budget allocated for Development is utilized in time and in a useful manner. Even though the major maintenance and repair works of the college are carried out through the Public Works Department of the Government of Kerala, minor and urgently needed repair works are done using CDC funds. In addition of chairman, the body consisting of Principal as secretary and treasurer, nominees of teachers, PTA, college union chairman and other eminent personalities nominated by the Director of Collegiate education as members. In this academic year the council met several times and the funds were allocated for various useful purposes.

#### Parent Teachers Association (PTA)

The Parent-Teacher Association of our college works based on a bye law, and follow due practices. It is the Organization that consists of Parents and Teachers of the College. The Parent of each student who is admitted in the college will become a member of the association. The PTA has been constituted in the general body and works with the help of executive members. The current PTA is a team of eminent personalities from among the parents with greater vision. Hence, they supported many of the academic and development activities of our college. PTA has offered all routine assistance to students in supporting their campus activities. It has ensured support to students participating in sports and arts festivals outside the campus. Scholarships and endowments were distributed in the merit day organized by PTA. A number of urgent maintenance and repair works were done by PTA ensuring the smooth functioning of the campus. Seminar advances and advances urgently requested for meeting various supporting activities are provided by PTA after careful evaluation of the request by the executive committee. In 2017-18 also, PTA has convened general body meetings and facilitated class level PTA meeting without fail. The body has served a pivotal role in the smooth functioning of the campus in a number of ways.
